DEADLINE REMINDER

Expiration of Transition Period under the Health Research Regulations for a health research project that commenced prior to 7 August 2018

- The Health Research Regulations made under the Data Protection Act 2018 came into effect on August 7th, 2018¹
- The time frame for obtaining explicit consent or a consent declaration from the Health Research Consent Declaration Committee (HRCDC) for the processing of personal data for a health research project that commenced prior to August 7th 2018 was due to expire on 30th April 2019. This has subsequently extended to 7th August 2019².
- Where an application is made for a consent declaration to the HRCDC before 7th July this will mean that the processing concerned will not in breach of the Regulations up until the time a decision is made by the Committee.

For your attention:

- All data controllers currently using personal data for health research, which <u>commenced prior to</u> <u>August 7th, 2018</u>, should consider whether they are currently compliant with the Health Research Regulations;
 - are you processing identifiable or pseudonymised³ personal data for health research?
 - have you obtained explicit consent⁴ from the data subject?

If you cannot obtain explicit consent and continue to process (which includes collecting, using, storing and disclosing) identifiable or pseudonymised personal data; You may need to consider applying to the HRCDC, for a consent declaration. - After August 7th, 2019, the HRCDC **cannot** consider applications made in relation to research that commenced prior to 7th August 2018.
- After this time, data controllers are likely to be in breach of the Health Research Regulations if they continue to process identifiable or pseudonymised personal data, without explicit consent.

- All applications for a consent declaration made to the HRCDC must be as complete as possible upon submission, with confirmed research ethics approval and completed data protection impact assessment.

**SUMMARY **

Submissions pre July 7th

•Applications submitted & pending a HRCDC decision - will not be in breach of the requirement to have explict consent

Submissions between July 7th - Aug 7th

•Applications submitted & pending a HRCDC decision - may be in breach of the requirement to have explict consent after 7th August

Submissions post August 7th

•Applications CAN NOT BE CONSIDERED by the HRCDC
